Meeting minutes for April 8, 2019. The North Carver Water District Commissioners met today at the Carver Town Hall, meeting Room #3, 108 Main Street, Carver, Massachusetts.

Meeting called to order at 5:39 PM, by Mr. Tracey

Draft FY20 – Discussion: Mr. Romano – Reviewed Town Warrant which is now posted on the website. Money coming from the Stabilization Fund to balance the budget. The amount is not what was previously voted on. Mr. Tracey – the use of the betterment stabilization fund is a conversation to continue with Mr. Milanoski. Per Mr. Milanoski there is a shortfall of \$50,000.

GAP 2 Grant / Generator Replacement: Mr. Siedentopf says FM Generator is to send Final Proposal which he has not seen yet. It would be cheaper to power a new pad than to use the old one. Mr. Woollam – Propane tanks and plumbing have to be changed out. Mr. Siedentof – Gave FM Generator the Wrightington contract, believes the grant would cover. Mr. Tracey – Balance should be covered by Town. Mr. Romano – confirmed nothing from the NCWD budget. Mr. Tracey – there is no guarantee what will happen at auction of equipment, any difference goes back to NCWD. Mr. Siedentopf - no install date or start date has been given. Will get one.

Rte. 44 Development, Urban Renewal Plan: Mr. Romano – A lot of clearing has taken place as a prelim to the redesign of Montello St. project engineering is ongoing.

Water Operator Report: Mr. Woollam – Middleboro flushing on the 16th. Last bill for 16,000 but not sure if that's water used or time. This is not something NCWD can do; volume cannot be created, no stand pipe. It was not done last year. Two radios (Arrowhead & Plymouth Sts.) died during last reading and will need to be replaced, expects another 10-20 to die in the next few years. Mr. Tracey – there is \$1500 in the budget for meter replacement. Go ahead and replace. Going to try and get records of install dates as radios have a ten year life. Need to start putting money aside for the Church. Priolo would get a better price by buying his own meters in bulk. Fiscal '21 budget will have to accommodate purchase of new meters. Mr. Woollam – Domestic has been turned on at the Church. It was broken due to a defective fitting. Fire is still off. High hazard device has to be installed. There is some pushback from the contractor. Five new minimum use to be on.
