Fire Request: Self-contained breathing apparatus: a grant has been submitted,

but in the event it is rejected the funds will be needed. A portion of the Fire budget is going toward repairing gear. On track to meet financial goals, but may need the reserves if there are any failures.

EMS Request: Intravenous pumps which are required by the state. 3 are required.

Auto Chest Compression Machine: No grant available for this. It

allows for 'non-standard' situations which are common.

School Request: Technology which is part of a 2-year request & roll-out of

Chromebooks-450 per year. Requesting FY '16 funds to rollover in

addition to the \$55,000 being request for a total request of

\$110,000.

Decommissioning of the Waste Water Treatment Plant: It is now shut down, the inside needs to be removed & an engineer to be hired to transform it into a grounds-keeping garage.

HS Gym Bleachers-need repairs done before floor can be repaired.

Press Box at football field is unsafe-would be looking for all forms of community support for purchase of materials, design &

construction to lower the cost.

MHS Auditorium Carpet is worn & it is the most used space in the building.

Track & Field will need to be addressed soon as there are large cracks in the track and wear & tear will become detrimental to using it in the near future.

Police:

There is a need for one cruiser.

Strategic Long-Range Plan will be helpful in moving forward & being transparent to the community & experts in the police field outside of the town are needed to do that. Using that plan would make it possible to accurately predict future needs of the department including a building.

Resource officer Melo has been helping the schools and families have more access to support.

TA:

The estimated debt service does not include the Police Station building & Fire Station bond amounts are estimated and will be update to more accurate figures after the vote (which will be less than stated).
