### ANNUAL TOWN MEETING WARRANT

### COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS

Plymouth, ss. To either of the constables of the Town of Carver, Plymouth County, Greeting:—

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you are directed to notify the inhabitants of the Town of Carver qualified to vote in elections and in town affairs to meet at the Town Hall in said Carver on Monday the 3rd day of March at 8.45 o'clock in the forenoon then and there to act on the following articles.

- Art. 1. To see if the Town will authorize the Town Treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen to borrow money from time to time in anticipation of the revenue of the financial year, beginning January 1st, 1930.
- Art. 2. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to prosecute, compromise or defend suits for or against the Town.
  - Art. 3. To decide when taxes shall become due.
- Art. 4. To see if the Town will make an appropriation for a Police Force, and act anything thereon or thereto.
- Art. 5. To choose all necessary Town Officers not elected by ballot.
- Art. 6. To see what disposition the Town will make of the dog fund.
- Art. 7. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.
- Art. 8. To see what pay the town will vote the Treasurer, Collector of Taxes, and other town officers for the ensuing year.
- Art. 9. To see what compensation the town will vote for labor, trucks and teams on the highways for the ensuing year and act thereon.

- Art. 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the observance of Memorial Day, and act thereon.
- Art. 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$2,000.00 for the purpose of resurfacing or otherwise improving Center Street, provided an allotment is received from the State and County, and act anything thereon or thereto.
- Art. 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$2,000.00 for the purpose of further improving Tremont Street towards the Plymouth line and act anything thereon or thereto.
- Art. 13. To see if the Town will vote to rescind its vote creating the office of Road Commissioners and abolish that office, such abolition to be effective at the date of the annual Town Meeting in 1931, so that thereafter a superintendent of streets will be appointed by the Selectmen in accordance with G. L. Chapter 41, Sect. 63, and act thereon or thereto. By request of the Finance Committee.
- Art. 14. To see if the Town will vote to accept a parcel of land from Henry A. Atwood enclosed by the junction of Pope's Point and Meadow Streets for the purpose of a public park to be under the supervision of the Park Commissioners, and act thereon.
- Art. 15. To see if the Town will vote the use of the Carver Town Hall for the purpose of promoting indoor sports among the younger people of Carver, and act thereon. By request.
- Art. 16. To see if the Town will vote to accept the German Field Gun from the Julian Southworth Post American Legion, and act thereon.
- Art. 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$680.62 for the purpose of erecting a memorial to the veterans of the World War, and act thereon.
- Art. 18. To see if the Town will vote to elect by nomination a committee of two to act with the Julian South-

worth Post, American Legion Memorial Committee in carrying out the purpose stated in Article 17 and act thereon. By petition.

- Art. 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money estimated not to exceed \$450.00 for the purpose of constructing separate toilet buildings for the boys and girls at the following points: South Carver—One new toilet for girls, to be located at rear of lot not less than fifty feet from present toilet building the distance between to be greater if practicable: Center Carver—"Special school for retarded children"—One new toilet building for girls, to be located at rear of lot, and not less than fifty feet from present building: North Carver—Present toilet building to be condemned as a toilet and two separate toilet buildings erected, one for boys and one for girls, said buildings to be located at a suitable distance from the schoolhouse building and not less than fifty feet apart, the distance between to be greater if found practicable. All four of the above buildings to have shingled roofs and shingled or weather-boarded on the outside and painted, and to be constructed in a sanitary, weather proof and work-man-like manner. And: Instruct the Carver School Committee, to cause said buildings to be erected as soon as weather conditions permit, but in no event later than the opening of the 1930 fall term, and act anything thereon or thereto. By petition.
- Art. 20. To see if the Town will vote to accept cemetery funds, and act anything thereon or thereto.
- Art. 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the use of the Plymouth County Trustees for County aid to Agriculture the sum of \$100.00 and choose a town director as provided in Secs. 41 and 45 of Revised Chapter 128 of the General Laws and act thereon or thereto.
- Art. 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$75.00 for rental

for the American Legion. Money to be paid to the commander of the Sons of Veterans, and to act thereon or thereto. By request.

Art. 23. To see if the Town will vote to accept the report of the Selectmen and other Town Officers.

Art. 24. To choose all necessary Town Officers: The following Officers to be voted for all on one ballot viz: Moderator, Treasurer, Town Clerk, Collector of Taxes, Three Auditors, Three Constables, Three Herring Committeemen, Tree Warden and Assessor, each for one year. One Selectman, One Assessor, One School Committeeman, One Cemetery Commissioner, One Park Commissioner, One Road Commissioner, One member of Public Welfare, and two Library Trustees, each for three years.

And you are directed to serve this warrant, by posting up attested copies thereof, at the several places designated by vote of the Town seven days at least before the time of holding said meeting.

The polls will be open at 12 o'clock noon and will be open for at least four hours.

Hereof fail not and make due return of this warrant, with your doings thereon, to the Town Clerk, at the time and place of meeting aforesaid.

# REPORT OF SCHOOL COMMITTEE

The policy of this department as to school property, referred to in previous reports, has been continued during the past year. Minor repairs have been made at all the

school houses. At North Carver more especial attention has been needed. Badly leaking roofs on the school house and the out buildings have been reshingled, the poorly lighted third and fourth grade room has been improved by additional windows and a much needed cloak room has been built at the entrance to the second grade room. As forecasted in the report a year ago, the Center school has been equipped with a radio outfit which has proven very useful. A portable motion picture machine, which can be used in any of the schools, has been added to the general school equipment. Telephones have been installed in the Center, North and South school houses.

The building originally used as Town Hall, and more recently owned and occupied by the local American Legion Post, has become again the property of the Town, and has been repaired and fitted for school purposes. The special school, in which, during half of each day, the pupils receive instruction in various forms of hand work, is being conducted in this building.

The addition of a fourth school to our system makes an increase in the budget of the department inevitable. The appropriation asked for is \$33,200.00. The reimbursement of the Town from the State of Massachusetts, on account of schools for the past year, amounts to \$7,801.90; and the Town receives \$813 for the tuition of pupils who come from other towns to our schools. This income of \$8,614.90 reduces the actual cost of the schools to the sum of \$24,585.10.

# REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Committee and Citizens of Carver:
I herewith submit my seventh annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

#### CHANGES IN THE TEACHING FORCE

Miss Margaret Hansberry resigned to enter business in Osterville. Mrs. Eunice Bailey was elected and assigned to the first grade at South Carver. She did excellent work during the Fall term, but resigned in December, and Miss Margery Griffith has been assigned to that position.

The opening of the Special School necessitated the employment of a new teacher, and Mrs. Blanche Howell of Middleboro was elected to that position. This school has certainly justified itself in the changed attitude of the pupils attending. Given work within their comprehension and ability, they are making a response which is very gratifying, and Mrs. Howell is meeting a difficult situation with tact and skill, giving unstintedly of time and energy.

The teaching staff is to be commended most heartily for the earnestness and professional spirit shown. Those attending the extension courses at Plymouth in Mental Hygiene and in Boston have reported much pleasure as well as profit, and their attendance manifests the attitude of the true teacher.

#### SCHOOL COSTS

To show the relative standing of the town in its group, I append figures from the annual report of the Commissioner of Education.

In Group IV,—Towns of less than 5,000 population and not maintaining High Schools, (125 towns being included) Carver receives the following listing:

This rank of 60 places the town slightly below the average of the group in expenditures per pupil from all sources — local tax and State Aid — though expending somewhat more than the State average. We enjoy a much better rank in the amount expended per pupil from local taxation, spending approximately the State average. This high rank for the year ending in June, 1929, will fall another year, as our reimbursement from the State has materially increased in the distribution this year. The net cost per pupil for High School education for the past year has been \$72.68, the average for the State being \$97.39.

#### MARKS AND MARKING

In co-operation with other towns, we have adopted the report card suggested by the Superintendents' Association after conference with the Department of Education. This card records the teacher's judgment of the child's effort and progress every ten months. In case of serious falling behind during the marking period, a supplementary slip is sent to the parent indicating the needed special work.

The chief purpose of the report card is to acquaint the parent with the progress being made by the child. It represents the teacher's best judgment. There is often

misunderstanding by the parent which leads to criticism of the teacher and the school. When a child who has received high marks under a teacher of the previous year, receives a lower mark in the higher class, it does not necessarily mean injustice on the part of the teacher. Each advance brings new subject matter, perhaps difficult for the child to grasp; a higher standard to be met, and often a different attitude toward work upon the child's part. In such cases the parent should seek information from the teacher as to the work being done.

The entire teaching staff have given themselves earnestly to the task set before them. There is a trite saying that, "As the teacher, so the school," which is in the main true, yet really able teachers can only do successful work when the home cooperates to the fullest degree. It is with regret that I feel obliged to record an apparent lack of interest upon the part of many homes.

In this connection I urge upon both parents and teachers the need for organized effort. To quote from the Journal of the National Education Association:

"The Parent-Teacher movement is one of the great forces in American life. No school can do the most for its children without full understanding, entire sympathy, and immediate, daily working cooperation with the homes. Every really live school has a Parent-Teacher Association, and that association, if it is genuinely alive to its larger opportunities, wishes to be a part of the nation-wide movement which is helping in so many ways to improve child life. The National Congress of Parents and Teachers is the greatest phase of adult education today. Parents are actually studying their problems.

"The primary task of the parent-teacher movement is not to make better patrons — it is to make better parents. This means that every alert principal and teacher must put his mind to the task and be in some measure a leader or encourager in the study by parents of the pressing problems that center around the rearing of their children.

Nothing less than eager, sustained, earnest study will enable the parents of this generation to do full justice to the needs of their children. Happily enough, the school will reap an immediate reward for every effort put into this movement, because better homes mean better schools."

#### HEALTH

A healthy, strong, vigorous body should be the basis upon which we build in the case of every child. Without this we cannot expect to develop to the highest the intellectual, moral and spiritual forces of the youth entrusted to us.

The results accomplished in other places prove beyond question the value of intensive work by dental clinics. The large percentage of poor teeth in our schools calls for action. Few, if any parents, realize to what a serious degree the poor condition of the child's teeth affects his conduct both in school and out, and what a handicap is placed upon his progress in the work he should do. In one school a boy of fifteen in the fourth grade was continually fighting — no amount of punishment seemed effective. The X-ray showed badly abscessed teeth, and in five weeks after treatment the boy was completely changed. From a lazy, troublesome lad, ready to become a criminal, he was turned into an ardent student leading his class.

In Atlantic Technical High School the principal would never expel any boy. Other principals complained of this, and to maintain a friendly spirit, the former offered to take their problem cases into the Technical High. They sent him thirty-seven so-called incorrigibles. Thorough examination and treatment resulted in the granting of degrees to twenty-six of them.

Parents must see to it that the child has proper food. It is especially important that the child eats a proper breakfast. In one school system investigation showed

that of one hundred truants, ninety had no breakfast. In the case of seventy-five loafers whose physical examination revealed a low blood count, whose attendance was 34%, proper feeding resulted in raising the attendance to 90%. Right food, plenty of sleep, and proper habits of elimination will bring a hundred fold return in health, happiness and improved work.

Our school physician and nurse are doing their best. The final result rests with the parents, and only through their hearty cooperation and willingness to carry out the suggestions given, can success be obtained.

## **IMPROVEMENTS IN 1929**

The new porch on the rear room at North Carver will be greatly appreciated. It provides added room for clothing and light for the school room as well as shelter. The additional windows in the South room have added greatly to the cheeriness and increased the usefulness of blackboards.

The motion picture machine is proving stimulating, and with the new year we shall be able to secure better allotments.

We all appreciate the generosity, and the up-to-date equipment has caused much favorable comment by visiting representatives of several State Departments.

It is a great pleasure to meet with such hearty cooperation in the 4-H club work. This year we have added Handicraft Clubs to those already established, and are looking forward to a most successful year.

In closing this report, I wish to express appreciation to the School Committee for their cordial support to the teachers for their earnest effort to improve our schools and to the parents for their interest and help in many ways.
